YOUR PERIOD-FRIENDLY BATHROOM GUIDE

Make a period-friendly zone

A period-friendly bathroom isn't *just* a nice thing to have, although, it **is** a nice thing to have! It's deeper than that. Having a space that is comfortable and convenient, and that promotes a period-positive attitude prevents learning disruptions for younger people with periods, and encourages grown up menstruators to practice self-care and feel confident



Let's see the pads!

Keep your products visible and accessible – for everyone

Period products are normal, natural and necessary. Instead of hiding them away in a box or drawer, organise them in clear containers in an obvious area.

Tip: Not everyone is a tampon or pad gal. So make sure to include a variety of options (tampons, pads and cups – if available) so that everyone feels catered for.

KEEP IT TIDY

Keeping period products tidy and ensuring a consistent supply of bins in public toilets is essential for hygiene, comfort, and dignity.

- Remember to bin your pads and tampons, not flush them!
- Have a bin handy in both the toilet stall and near the sink
- Line the bin with biodegradable bags for easy disposal





- Empty the bin regularly for hygiene reasons
- Choose a bin with a lid for privacy
- Mave handwash handy

PROVIDE TAMPON INSERTION ADVICE

Because using a tampon can take a little practice, ensure you always have the instruction leaflet handy for someone to read.


